
Branch & Limb Collection: 7 AM on MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 26th

Branches and limbs MUST be placed at your trash collection site BY 7 AM on MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 26TH. We will collect from each street ONE TIME ONLY. Any branches/limbs put out AFTER the week of September 26th will be YOUR responsibility to dispose of.

Limbs may be up to 6" in diameter and 4" to 6" in length. Do not bundle. Yard waste such as ornamental grass, garden residue, etc., will not be picked up. The Borough reserves the right to refuse items that do not meet the requirements and is not responsible for cleanup.

Fall Leaf Collection: Approx. Oct. 3 – Nov. 23

The pickup schedule is variable depending on weather conditions. *We appreciate your understanding that this schedule must be flexible.* Please place leaves at the curb, they will not be picked up if they are placed elsewhere. Do not mix any other items with the leaves. We will get to your leaves as soon as we can. There will be no collection on Borough holidays. **Leaves in plastic trash bags will not be picked up.**



IMPORTANT NOTE: The Public Works Facility cannot accept yard waste items at their location. You can take those items to the York County Solid Waste Authority's Resource Recovery Center where it will be diverted to their Yard Waste Transfer Facility, provided it is free of contaminants and meets end user requirements. Yard waste includes leaves, garden residues, shrubbery, tree trimmings that do not exceed 6' in length or 24" in diameter and tree stumps that do not exceed 24" in diameter. NOTE: Before doing this, visit their website at www.ycswa.com, or call them at 717-845-1066, for requirements and restrictions you will need to be aware of.




Christmas Tree Collection: January 3 - 13

The Borough will pick up discarded Christmas trees beginning January 3rd.

Trees should be placed at your usual trash pickup site and **MUST NOT** be in a bag.

All decorations and tinsel must be removed.





RECYCLING INFORMATION

TIME FOR A REFRESHER COURSE IN RECYCLING

Check out this Facebook posting by Penn Waste: "A big problem is 'hopeful recycling', which means people will put things in recycling bins that they want to be recyclable but should really be thrown out. So, diapers, car parts, hoses, electrical cords, medical waste, clothing, mattresses. We have gotten deer carcasses! Deer season is a horrible time of year at our recycle center." Due to the recent change in China's recycling policy, there is added pressure to get these sometimes-hazardous items out of the recycle stream. Take a minute and read the following pointers:

- Educate yourself on what items Penn Waste, <u>www.pennwaste.com</u>, can recycle.
- **Do not throw items in the recycle bin** unless you know for sure it is recyclable.
- When in Doubt, Throw It Out!
- Make sure that wet, non-recyclable items are tossed in the garbage.

Yard Waste



Are you wondering what you should do with your yard waste as we are in full swing in the season of raking leaves? Let me give you some tips.

Most municipalities offer yard waste pick-up at your curb which makes yard waste disposal very easy. Contact your municipality or waste hauler directly to find out what services are available to you. If yard waste services are not available to you, no worries. There are other options to help you.

If you simply have leaves and grass, you can use a mulching mower to mulch them. Your back will thank you and the clippings on the lawn will help prevent weeds from germinating. Another option for disposal of grass and leaves is to place them in your garden beds and around trees and shrubs to prevent weed growth. Composting your clippings and leaves is another great way to make use of them. If you are unsure how to do this, do an internet search for "composting". You will find instructions for different composting methods and a list of materials needed.

If those options aren't your cup of tea, you can dispose of vegetation and small branches with your regular garbage or bring your yard waste to the York County Resource Recovery Center (YCRRC). Be sure to visit https://www.ycswa.com/disposal-of-household-waste/yard-waste/ for specifics on what can and cannot be accepted at the YCRRC. There are some items that we cannot accept, however our website will direct you to a business that can help you if the YCRRC cannot accommodate your needs.

Backyard Composting

York County residents are invited to register for a Backyard Composting Workshop. York County Solid Waste Authority, in partnership with Horn Farm Center, is offering workshops to teach residents how to use both yard waste and food waste to create a composting bin. Each hands-on session will emphasize affordability and simplicity. Workshops will be held at Horn Farm Center located in Hellam Township on the following dates and times:

Saturday, September 3rd, 10am-12pm Thursday, September 22nd, 5pm-7pm

Participants will enjoy their time on the farm as they construct a new compost pile on site, have the opportunity to turn/mix/flip a pre-existing pile and have the opportunity to see an active pile that is late in the decompositional



process. There will be plenty of time for questions during the interactive workshop which will provide details about materials needed, how to keep the composting bin properly balanced and much more. Participants will leave with their own twelve-foot roll of welded wire to get them started on their own backyard composting bin, a composting brochure that highlights important information covered in the class, and hopefully an appreciation for the natural process of decomposition.

Each workshop will cover the same information. Space is limited to 15 participants and sessions are expected to fill quickly. Those who are interested are encouraged to sign up early. Registration will close when the workshop is filled or one week prior to the start of the session. Visit https://hornfarmcenter.org/backyard-composting/ to register.

Tours and Programs

Did you know that YCSWA offers FREE tours and programs? It's true! If you are looking for a fun, educational activity to do with your family, classroom or civic group, read on to learn more details about the tours and programs we offer.

YCSWA staff offer tours of the York County Resource Recovery Center (YCRRC). Here, all of York County's municipal trash that is combustible is turned into electricity. The trash you take to the curb each week is delivered to this facility. It is dropped into a combustion barrel and burned. As the trash burns, it heats up water to create steam. That steam travels to a turbine which is connected to a metal rod. The rotational energy of the rod is turned into electricity and can be used to power 20,000 homes at any given time of day. Fascinated by the process? Visit https://www.ycswa.com/tour-the-york-county-resource-recovery-center-2/ to learn more.

We also give tours of the Hopewell Area Recreation Complex (HARC). This beautiful area was once a working landfill. The landfill is currently closed and it houses ball fields, playgrounds, a pavilion and walking trails. More than 122 species of birds have been spotted at this site. Birds aren't the only flying friends you will see at HARC. Monarch butterflies are frequently spotted at certain times of the year. They are attracted to the milkweed that has been planted in the grasslands at HARC. Visit https://www.ycswa.com/harc-tours/ to read more about HARC.

YCSWA staff offer a variety of programs which can be scheduled in-person or virtually throughout the year. One of the most enjoyed hands-on programs available is Vermicomposting: Worms with an Appetite! This program focuses on how we can recycle food waste with a little help from worms. Each participant makes their very own worm cup bin to take come with them, complete with a few worms. They are taught how some food waste can be added to the cup and it will be eaten by the worms who will then produce a rich material that can be used to help plants grow. Want more information, visit https://www.ycswa.com/environmental-education-programs/worm-composting/.

Another program favorite is Recycled Paper Revelations! This program focuses on the importance of being responsible with waste and being mindful about recycling. Participants get to learn about the paper wasp and hear how it creates a paper-like nest. They also learn about how paper has been made for many years using trees and water. YCSWA staff then talk about the importance of preserving our natural resources and the importance of recycling. Those in attendance will make a recycled piece of paper. For more information, visit https://www.ycswa.com/environmental-education-programs/recycled-paper-revelations/.

It is one of our goals to educate the community on how to responsibly dispose of trash. The tours and programs above are just a few ways we meet that goal. Please feel free to contact us with any waste-related question.

Local Emergency Planning Committee

In this edition of the newsletter I thought I'd address our county's LEPC. I have served on this committee in both the private sector (with General Dynamics) and both York Township and Red Lion EMA.

Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) was established under Act 165 of 1990. The responsibility of LEPC is to receive information about hazardous chemicals, analyze the information, and develop plans for responding to chemical emergencies within York County. LEPC is comprised of a broad representation of the community including elected officials, law enforcement, the fire community, health and environmental workers, the news media, along with local business owners and operators. These individuals volunteer their time to attend meetings, review plans and provide education to the residents of the County.

LEPC, through the SARA Planning Specialist, assists industries with planning, training and exercises, and coordination with emergency responders. It is through this outreach that emergency responders along with industry, strengthen their ability to respond to real chemical emergencies, in the event that one would occur.

WHAT ARE GOVERNMENTS DOING?

Governments are taking proactive steps to protect chemicals from misuse, including:

- · Working with industry to improve chemical security.
- Implementing a program to assess the security risk of chemicals.
- Consulting extensively with industry to get a clear and realistic picture of how chemicals are used and sold.
- Identifying areas to improve in the security of chemicals.
- Informing the community on how to help identify and report suspicious use of chemicals

The York County LEPC meets at 10 am on the third Tuesday of every other month, beginning in February. The meeting is held at the York County Emergency Services Center, 120 Davies Drive, York, PA 17402.

ZONING & CODES ENFORCEMENT

From the Desk of our Zoning & Codes Enforcement Officer, Dan Shaw:

QUALITY OF LIFE TICKETING PROGRAM

Red Lion Borough has implemented a Quality of Life Ticketing Program. This program is for certain property maintenance violations and is similar to the Red Lion Borough parking violation tickets. When a problem property is identified by a Red Lion Borough Code Official, a courtesy notice identifying the violation will be posted on the property. If the violation is not corrected within the time specified on the notice, a violation ticket will be issued and posted on the property or delivered to an adult resident of the property. Fines will start at \$25 for the first offense and will increase with each additional violation, up to \$300. Tickets are to be paid within ten (10) days of receipt in accordance with the instructions on the ticket. If not paid within those ten days, a citation will be issued through the district magistrate's office, which will include additional court costs. Some of the most common violations include:

Nuisance vehicles Items not for outside storage Grass and weeds over 6" Accumulation of refuse



SNOW AND ICE ON SIDEWALKS

Snow and ice must be cleared or treated on sidewalks to a width of 36" within 12 hours after the snow stops or the ice forms. If the snow stops or ice forms after 6 PM, it must be removed or treated by 6 PM the following day. A Quality of Life violation ticket will be issued without a courtesy notice. It is also unlawful to place any snow or ice into a public street or alley. The most complaints come from the school district or the parents of children who walk to school or to the bus stop. SO PLEASE REMEMBER, OUR CHILDREN NEED A SAFE WALKING SURFACE TO SCHOOL AND BACK!

BUILDING & ZONING PERMITS

Most maintenance to residential properties does not require a building or zoning permit; however, additions, structural changes or repairs, sheds, fences, and walls will require a permit. Commercial properties typically require a building permit for almost all types of work. Contact the Borough Office for more information.

SIDEWALK PERMITS

A permit is required to replace the curb and sidewalk which is along a public street. There is no fee for the permit. The applicant must pick up a copy of the specifications.

SNOW EMERGENCIES

In the event of a severe winter storm, the Mayor may declare a snow emergency. Local radio and television stations will be advised, and it will be posted on our website. You shall not park a motor vehicle or allow a vehicle to remain parked on Main Street, High Street or Broadway after a snow emergency is declared. Fines start at \$75.00 and may be assessed every eight hours.

TRASH & LARGE ITEM COLLECTION

Do not place trash or large items at the point of collection more than 12 hours before your collection day, which is on Friday for all residential customers. Refuse being stored for collection must be placed in a container which shall not permit blowing or scattering by wind and shall be rodent-proof, insect-proof, and watertight. If you have a different circumstance, please call our office and we will work with you.

NUISANCE VEHICLES

The outdoor storage of any motor vehicle that is without a valid inspection certificate displayed for a period more than 30 days is a nuisance and must be removed or stored in a fully enclosed structure.



TENANT REGISTRATION

Landlords must register all occupants over the age of 18 within 30 days of occupancy of a residential rental unit.

TENANT COMPLAINTS

Red Lion Borough has a housing maintenance and occupancy code which deals with the maintenance of residential dwellings. If you have a complaint about your rental unit, a complaint form is available in our office.

HOUSING

No owner or occupant shall install, operate, or use an unvented space heater employing a flame. This would include unvented portable gas and kerosene heaters.

TREE TRIMMING

To avoid damage to borough equipment, personal vehicles and for the safety of everyone, trees must be kept trimmed to a height of 14' above and along the edge of the roadway and 9' above sidewalks.

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE ABOUT STORMWATER

FROM RED LION BOROUGH & RED LION MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY

Unfortunately, the problems associated with stormwater are not limited to major storms; they often result from the average rainfall event. Human activities have altered the landscape so dramatically that the natural system for stormwater management no longer works.

Consider the path rainfall takes when it hits the ground: it either soaks into the ground to become groundwater, evaporates, or flows over the surface of the land. This overland runoff—stormwater—feeds our surface waters, but it also carries sediments, chemicals, automobile oil, trash, and other natural and not so natural debris along with it. Groundcover, trees, soil, wetlands, and a wide range of other landscape features act as buffers and barriers that slow stormwater, trap or filter out pollutants, and enable infiltration and evaporation to occur.

Nature continuously recycles the Earth's water supply through a dynamic process that has existed for millions of years. This water cycle (or hydrologic cycle) moves rainfall from the atmosphere to land, through surface and groundwater systems, to the ocean, and back into the atmosphere. The water cycle is made up of

several basic components: evaporation (and transpiration), condensation, precipitation, infiltration, groundwater recharge, and runoff.

Anyone who has looked at local rivers and streams during a storm can see the effects of runoff. Soil that washes off construction sites; trash, cigarette butts, and other litter that has washed from parking lots; antifreeze and oil that has dripped from cars and trucks; fertilizers and pesticides from golf courses, fields, and lawns; nutrients from agricultural operations; grit and salt from de-icing roadways: all this and more can be flushed directly into waterways when it rains.

The more we alter the landscape, the more we affect the natural cycle and its ability to deal with runoff. When we grade and cut and pave and build, we are not only causing more polluted water to move into waterways more quickly, we are making less water available for absorption into the ground. Believe it or not, that can affect stream flow and the aquifers we depend on for drinking water in many parts of the state.

There was a time when "point source pollution" flowing into waterways from industry and sewage treatment facilities was the biggest threat to water quality. Today, non-point source pollution (such as abandoned mine drainage, atmospheric deposition, earth moving activities, on-lot septic systems, timber harvesting, and runoff from urban areas and agricultural lands) is the cause of most water quality problems across the country, including here in Pennsylvania.

In many parts of the state, stormwater overwhelms aging sewage infrastructure, causes flood damage, and puts people's health at serious risk. Unfortunately, these problems are not limited to major storms; they often result from the average rainfall event. Human activities have altered the landscape so dramatically that the natural system of "stormwater management" no longer works.

The average annual precipitation in Pennsylvania ranges from less than 34 inches to more than 50 inches per year, with most coming during small, frequent storms. Some 65% of the state's average annual rainfall occurs in storms that drop less than 1 inch in a 24-hour period; more than 95% comes from storms of 3 inches or less. Even though Pennsylvania has been hit by several tropical storms and hurricanes over the past century—with devastating results—the large 50-year and 100-year storms occur so rarely that they account for an insignificant amount of total rainfall volume when averaged out year after year.

Dealing with rainfall from the many small storm events, while planning for the massive volume spikes that do occur during major storms, is the key to stormwater management success. PENNSYLVANIA'S WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Pennsylvania's Weatherization Assistance Program increases energy efficiency in homes by reducing energy costs and increasing comfort while safeguarding health and safety.

This federally funded program provides services to low-income (at or below 200% of the federal poverty level-see chart below) homeowners and renters. There is no cost to either the homeowner, landlord or tenant; however, landlord permission is required.

Some services that may be provided include attic and basement insulation, water heater and pipe insulation, window and door weather-stripping, caulking, broken glass replacement and glazing. Also the heating system and water heater are tested for efficiency and safety. Inefficient or unsafe heating systems will be repaired or replaced. All work is done on an as needed basis.



HALLOWEEN FIRE SAFETY TIPS

- When choosing a costume, stay away from long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he or she can see out.
- Provide children with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.
- Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper catch fire easily. Keep all decorations away from open flames and other heat sources like light bulbs and heaters.
- Use a battery-operated candle or glow-stick in jack-o-lanterns. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit. When lighting candles inside jack-o-lanterns, use long, fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. Be sure to place lit pumpkins well away from anything that can burn and far enough out of the way of trick-or-treaters, doorsteps, walkways and yards.

- **Make sure** all smoke alarms in the home are working.
- Tell children to stay away from open flames including jack-o-lanterns with candles in them. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire. (Have them practice, stopping immediately, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.)

If your children are going to **Halloween parties** at others' homes, have them look for ways out of the home and plan how they would get out in an emergency.



Decorations are the first thing to ignite in roughly **800** reported home fires each year. More than one-third of these fires were started by a candle.
